Ten years of government service by Fred Hodge were recognized Monday when he was presented with a Department of the Interior emblem tie-tac at an early morning staff meeting in the Vale District Office. G.R. Gurr, district manager, made the presentation.

Hodge began his government career in 1944 with the U.S. Marine Corps 6th Marine Division, 22nd Regiment. He later transferred into the Fleet Marine Force of the Pacific, Headquarters Division, that same year and was discharged in 1946. He was self-employed from 1946 to 1948, and following that was employed for the next two

years working at all phases of construction. In 1950 he started serving as supervisor of the Highway District for the State of Idaho, a position he held until 1956. At that time he moved to Vale where he again went into business for himself until 1961. That year he began working for the Vale BLM district and is employed at the present time as a Civil Engineering Technician.

I looked for months for this recipe - "Chocolate Crunch" made with Chow mein noodles. My reason - they are especially good and they make up in minutes. Store them in your Electric Freezer until you want to use them - otherwise the family will deplete your supply immediately.

CHOCOLATE CRUNCH

1 - 6 oz. pkg. chocolate chips
1 - 6 oz. pkg. butterscotch chips
1 - 3 oz. can chow mein noodles
1 cup shelled peanuts

Place chocolate and butterscotch chips in a 2 quart saucepan and melt over warm heat. Stir in nuts and chow mein noodles. Drop by teaspoonfuls on waxed paper and chill in refrigerator.

My daughter-in-law's mother (how's that for a title) is an excellent cook. She has lots of patience and serves things beautifully. Several years ago she gave me the recipe for

"Gold Rush Bars". I've made them for our church Guild and for my grandchildren. They passed with flying colors.

GOLD RUSH BARS

2 cups coarsely broken graham crackers
1 can sweetened condensed milk
1 - 6 oz. pkg chocolate chips
1 cup broken walnut meats

Mix the above together. Spread into a well buttered and floured 10 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cut into 1 inch squares while hot.
