Unemployment Insurance

Unemployment Insurance checks are now being mailed to the claimants' home addresses, and that claimants must still report at their regular

reporting times and offices in order to keep their claims current. Reporting at Employment Division offices must be continued regardless of the type of claim, regular, ex-service-men, former Federal and State employees, or Extended Benefit claimants. After the claimant reports on his claim, if he is eligible for another week's benefits, this information is forwarded to the Salem Central office, and a benefit check will be mailed direct to the claimant's home address.

The Employment Division also urged claimants to let their claims office know immediately of any change in address. Regular Unemployment Insurance benefit payments in Oregon this year through October 22, are still averaging more than \$1 million a week. Thus far more than \$43 million have been paid in regular benefits, plus \$4.3 million to former servicemen and former Federal employees totaling more than 84,000 individuals. In addition 20,115 have filed for Extended Unemployment benefits since Feb. 5, when first payments were made, and a total of \$7.3 million has been paid to those who had exhausted their regular benefits and were still unemployed.

A total of more than \$50.4 million in Unemployment Insurance benefits has been paid this year through Oct. 22, in all U.I. programs including to claimants of Extended Benefits, the Employment Division reported.
