- 1 tablespoon grated onion
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Cut cheese in small pieces and allow to come to room temperature. In a mixing bowl beat cheese until smooth and creamy; add onion, Worcestershire sauce and paprika and continue to beat until thoroughly blended. Shape into roll 6-inches long and 2 1/2-inches in diameter. Roll in nuts.
