

License Fee Hike On Tap For Hunters, Anglers

Archery hunters will have an increase in their license fees starting in 1972, the result of a law passed by the regular session of the 1971 Legislature. The new law, passed with the support of Oregon's organized bow hunters, requires that in addition to a regular hunting license, any person desiring to hunt with bow and arrow in an area designated exclusively for archery hunting must obtain a bow hunting license. The fee for this license is \$2 when purchased in combination with the regular hunting license and \$5 when purchased separately. A point for archers to remember is that the combination hunter-archer license will cost the Oregon hunter \$7 but if the documents are purchased separately, they will cost him \$10. Nonresidents are also subject

to the new law if they intend to bow hunt in Oregon. Both the regular hunting license and bow license are required to hunt in a designated archery area. The legislature also increased the nonresident hunting license fee to \$50, nonresident angling license to \$20, ten-day vacation angling license to \$10, and the daily angling license to \$2.50. However, anglers fishing on the daily license may angle for salmon and steelhead without purchasing the regular salmon-steelhead license. These changes take effect January 1, 1972. Hunters and fishermen who lose their licenses and request duplicates will pay a little more for this service than they have in the past. The charge for issuing duplicates will be \$1 instead of 50 cents.

Two TVCC Players Make JC All-American Team

Last week the National Junior College Athletic Association released its 1971 All-American selections and in the roster are two Treasure Valley Community College stalwarts, Bill Taylor, 1st team defense, and Jerry Sinclair, 2nd team offense.



Bill Taylor, six foot, 195 pound defensive middle linebacker from Klamath Falls, is a hard-nosed defensive leader who possesses outstanding quickness, says his coach, Gary Farnworth. An explosive tackler, he covered sideline to sideline as well as deep for passes. Taylor ranks among the three best linebackers in TVCC history along with Darrell Dominick and Paul Franks. Jerry Sinclair is six feet three inches tall and 210 pounds and comes to TVCC from Lebanon. According to coach Farnworth, Jerry is an outstanding 1 on 1 blocker who has the speed for trapping and pulling. His play blocking for tailback, Walter Liverpool, and pass protection for quarterback, Ray Peterson, were of inestimable help in their record breaking per-



performances. Jerry ranks with past All-American tackles Craig Stewart and Rick Wells.

However, the mailing of these documents is in progress and they should be in the hands of all agents within the next two weeks. Mailing is accomplished alphabetically by county. As a result, license agents in Baker or Clatsop County will have supplies on hand a few days prior to dealers in Washington

Army Announces Major Pay Increases

A Major Pay Raise for members of the UNITED STATES ARMY became effective today according to SSG John Mathews Army Recruiter for this area. The pay raise, which was enacted into law on September 28, had been withheld temporarily as part of President Nixon's freeze on prices and wages. Under the terms of the Military Pay Bill, newly-enlisted soldiers will receive \$268.00 or Yamhill County. Nonetheless, licenses and angling rule books will be available to hunters and fishermen well in advance of the new year.

This compares with \$134.40 under the previous law. The pay raise will not only include substantial increases in Basic Pay, but will also raise Quarters and Ration Allowances. The New Pay Scales are a giant step towards making Military Pay for lower ranking enlisted men and junior officers comparable with that offered by business and industry. According to U.S. Government Statistics, the average hourly wage in the manufacturing industry in 1970 was \$3.36. Army pay for a Sergeant, E-5, by comparison, will now amount to \$3.11 per hour if the Sergeant is au-

thorized and receiving quarters and ration allowances. If the same Sergeant were married, his hourly pay rate would rise to \$3.40. Army officials state the average service time required to reach the rank of Sergeant, E-5 is in the neighborhood of 22 months active service. "When coupled with the traditional Army benefits such as free medical and dental care, clothing, room and board and retirement benefits, the new pay increase makes Army service truly competitive as a career choice", the Army recruiter stated.
