CAP Fliers Set Records

The Civil Air Patrol continues on its record shattering course for the number of hours flown in support of search and rescue operations, and by year's end should easily top the previous high of 27,626 flown by that organization's volunteer fliers in 1969.

Thus far this year, Civil Air Patrol has averaged slightly better than 3,000 hours per month for a seven month 21,003.6 total flying time on aerial search missions called by the Air Force Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service.

In July, Civil Air Patrol volunteers logged 3008.6 hours, paced by the California Wing with 474.7.

Nine lives have been saved by Civil Air Patrol members in 1971, according to the Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service.

Civil Air Patrol, the official civilian volunteer auxiliary of the Air Force with a national membership in excess of 73,000 also launched 1,623 sorties on 43 missions during July.

Temura Named To Onion Board
