Toastmistress Club is open to all women who wish to "relate, educate, and communicate." Those interested are invited to call Mae Schireman at 372-3014 for reservations.

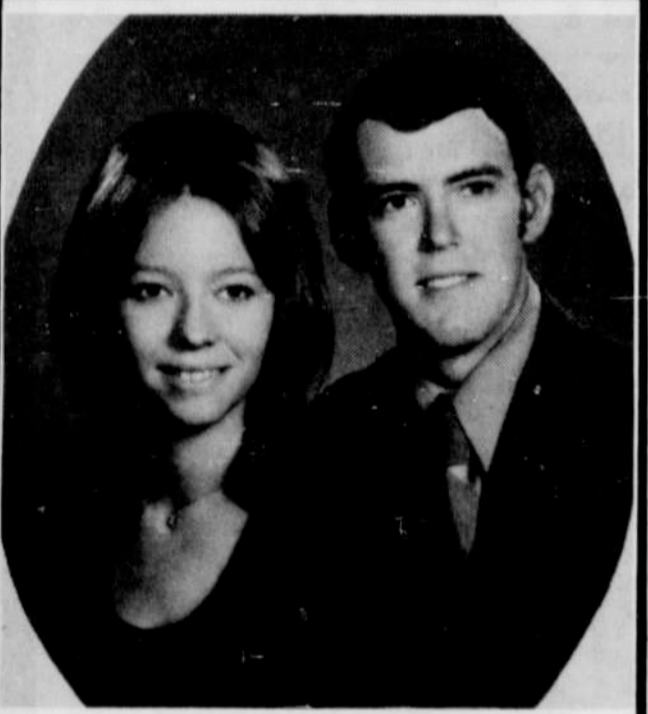
