Special morning programs have been planned this year for parents. University President Robert D. Clark will speak at one session, with an opportunity provided for questions and answers. Vice President for Student Services Gerald Bogen will preside at a second session, with a panel of personnel from Student Services speaking on various aspects of the program.

Parents and students will have separate luncheons. Dean Burton J. Moyer of the College of Liberal Arts will speak to parents at a luncheon in the Erb Memorial Union. Students will have luncheon in University dormitories.

U of O Preview starts at 8:30 a.m. on February 5 with registration and briefing.
