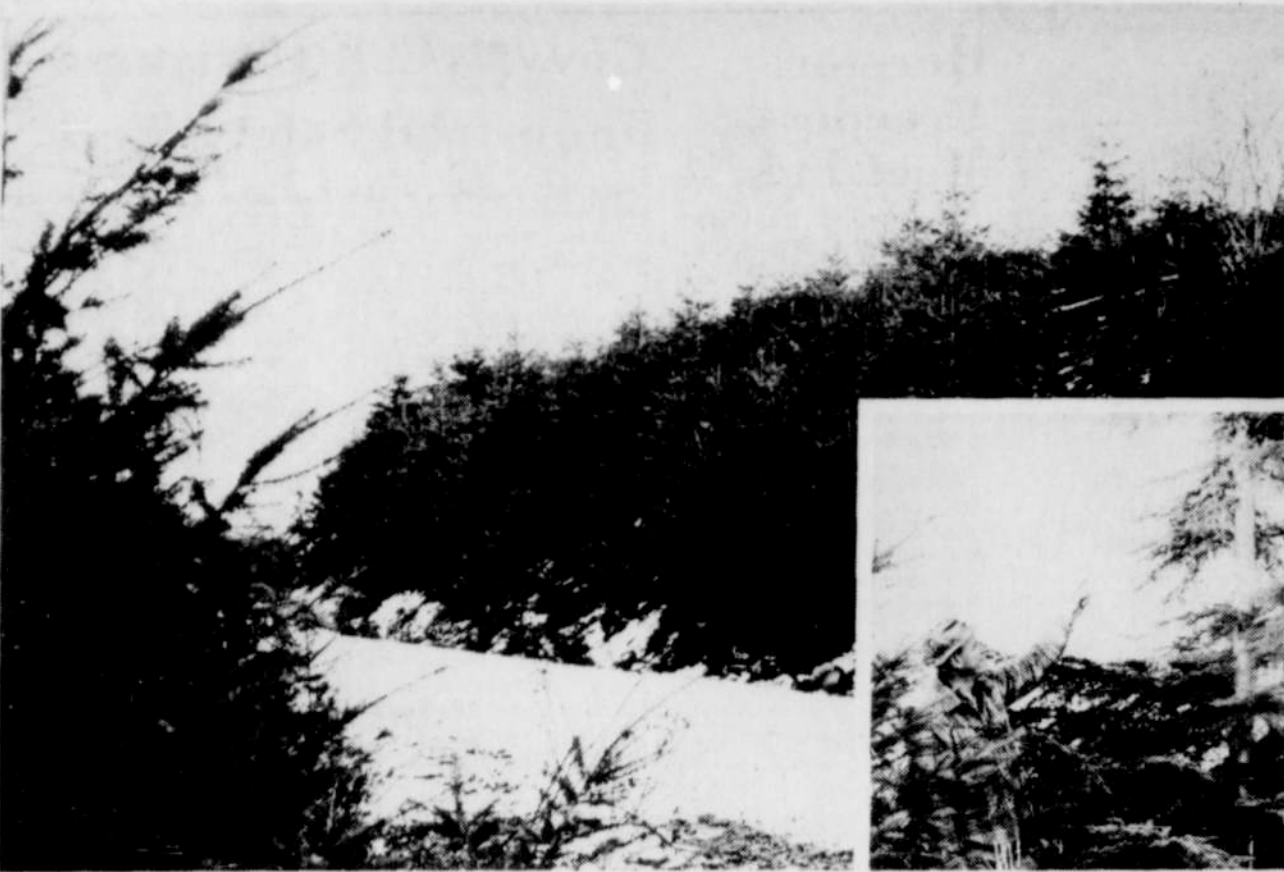


COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS
