GRANT CONTINUES RIP PROGRAM

William E. McLaughlin, the Regional Commissioner of the United States Office of Education, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Region X, announces the award of a \$39,450 grant to the Oregon State Board of Education. The grant is for the continuation of the Regional Interstate Project program.

The grant was made from funds made available under the Elementary Secondary Education Act, 1965, Title V, Section 505. Grants are made under this law to State educational agencies to pay part of the cost of experimental projects for developing State leadership or for the establishment of special services which hold promise of making a substantial contribution to the solution of problems common to the State educational agencies of all or several States, and for grants to public interstate commissions or agencies for educational planning and research.
