In the second row there are three small Bisque miniature dolls of 1905 to 1910 origin. Next is a Bisque Baby, year 1915 and a "Tin Head Dream Baby" of 1924. Nearly all of these dolls have movable eyes. The dolls are dressed in period costumes designed and made by Laura McDaniels.

All these dolls will be on display at the Antique Doll Show to be held Saturday, March 25, 12 to 9 p.m. and Sunday, Mar. 26 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Seven Mile Dance Hall on the corner of Highway 20 and Eagle Road. There will be hundreds of antique dolls

on display along with handcrafted dolls, doll accessories and antiques.

At the show there will be a sales table of everything imaginable, refreshments will be served and a door prize will be given.

Guest of honor will be the Idaho governor's wife, Mrs. Cecil Andrus. Each year a doll handmade by Julia Hopple and dressed by Rita Hartman is presented. This year the doll will be copied after Mrs. Andrus and dressed in clothing fashioned after Mrs. Andrus' inaugural ball gown.

The doll show is hosted by the Les Bois Doll Club of Boise which was organized four years ago and is the first club in Idaho to belong to the United Federation of Doll Clubs.

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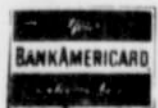
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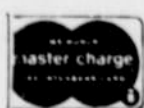
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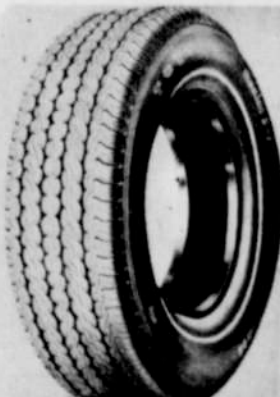
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
