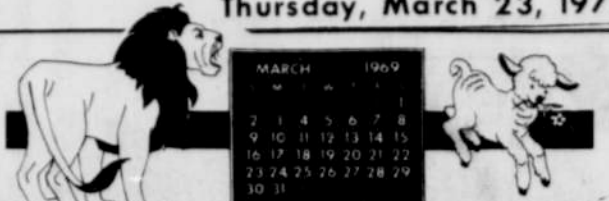
Karate Class Starts In Vale
