10 YEARS AGO

The following news article is from a Tupelo, Miss., newspaper. The item appeared in "For Women Only", a daily publication.

Mrs. Darwin (Julia) Jensen is an instructor for the Nancy Taylor Charm course at Ludwig Commercial College in Ontario.

It will be remembered that Mrs. Jensen won honors in May 1959 by placing third in the Mrs. Oregon Centennial contest finals in Portland. She is the mother of four boys and three girls and is active in affairs of the community and LDS Church.

Amalgamated Sugar Company reports that transient farm labor will start moving into the area about April 20. They recruited approximately 2300 workers. In addition, there will be that many women and children.

30 YEARS AGO

These producers are performing their part in the face of difficult handicaps, such as increasing prices and loss of labor to the armed services and defense industries.

Dairymen of this section have indicated that they intend to increase production through improvement in their herds rather than increasing their number of cows. It will save an excessive use of feeds.

Mrs. John Ostrom has received a letter from her sister in Sweden. The letter, which was two months enroute to Nyssa by air mail, cost \$1.40 for postage. Before the outbreak of the war letters reached the United States from Europe by boat in 11 days. The letter stated they had plenty of food in Sweden but are unable to buy coffee.

Beautiful globe locust trees will line the highway from Nyssa to Ontario a few years hence, if present plans of the Ontario Commercial Club materialize.

A tree committee announced that plans have been made to plant the trees this spring.

Owyhee Dam backed up a torrent of flood waters that gushed down the swollen channel of the Owyhee River at the rate of 15,000 cubic feet per second for close to 24 hours Monday. The torrent overturned a dragline that had been abandoned on the cofferdam. It cost the General Construction Company an estimated several thousand dollars damages.

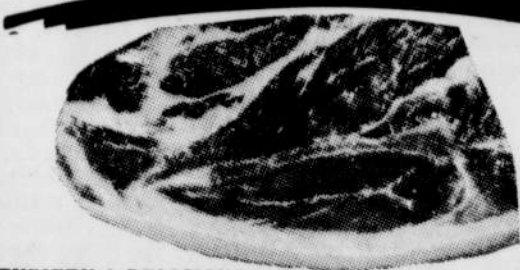
