20 YEARS AGO

The rampaging Malheur River forced half a dozen families from their homes at Vale and caused considerable property damage in that part of the county this week.

The Malheur River leaped its banks Wednesday morning, flooded the city park and rodeo grounds and crept into parts of the town. Because of the water conditions, school authorities closed the schools for Thursday and Friday for fear buses might be interrupted.

The Malheur River, reaching its highest point in 30 years washed out at least two bridges and threatened others. Streams were causing trouble between Vale and Burns.

That Nyssa has weathered the storm of high prices, tremendous post-war expansion and increased demands for service, yet has been able to keep its municipal finances on a better-than-average basis, was revealed Tuesday evening at a regional meeting of the League of Oregon Cities in Vale.
