Izaak Walton League Sponsors Hells Canyon Trip

A three-day white water adventure is available to 30 individuals May 15 through 17 which will take in about 100 miles of the Snake River in eastern Oregon up to Johnson Bar in the Hells Canyon sector, according to Chuck Collins, representative of the Izaak Walton League, sponsor of the trip. Bookings will be made on a first come, first served basis to anyone interested.

The trip in and out of Hells Canyon, deepest gorge in North America, will be made in the river boat Idaho Queen with Lewiston, Idaho the starting point. Guests will spend two nights at the Devil's Doorway Lodge near Cooper Creek and take side trips by jet boat, horseback, and on foot to scenic areas in the canyon. There will be ample opportunity for scenic and wildlife photography as well as to fish the famous Snake River for its smallmouth bass, rainbow trout, and other game fish.

Evenings will be devoted to group discussions on local history, geology, wildlife, and other natural wonders. Personnel from the U. S. Forest Service and the Game Commission will join the discussions as well as act as guides on the various side trips.

Collins said the Hells Canyon excursion will be comfortable and can be enjoyed by anyone physically able to make automobile trips. Women and young adults are welcome. Cost is expected to be about \$105 per person.

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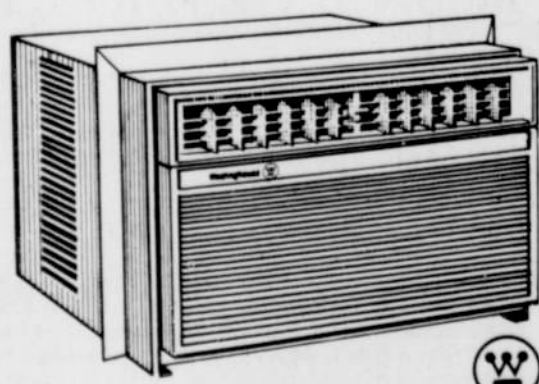
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
