The Oregon Game Commission today issued its annual reminder of "hands off" wildlife and their young of the year. For the next few months these youngsters will be found in their usual hiding places. Fawns will be born, upland game bird chicks will be hatching, waterfowl will be busy raising their young ones. It's the time of year for reproduction to take place as wildlife of all species reproduce their kind. And it is unlawful to molest them or take them home as pets.

of the intruder. Adoption and removal from the wild almost always leads to unnecessary death of wild youngsters. Their chances of survival are much greater if they are left alone, unhandled and undisturbed, right where they are discovered.

The young of any species require expert feeding and care and they usually will not survive away from their mothers. Some animals become dangerous to humans as they mature.

Invariably the circumstances under which these woodland creatures are discovered lead some persons to believe that they are orphaned, alone and helpless. This is far from the truth as the parent animal is usually nearby, hiding in fear

Although Oregon fawns are generally born in May and June, this early reminder is to alert outdoor travelers to leave them alone. To molest any wildlife or to take the young home are illegal acts.

Coquilles St. Jacques

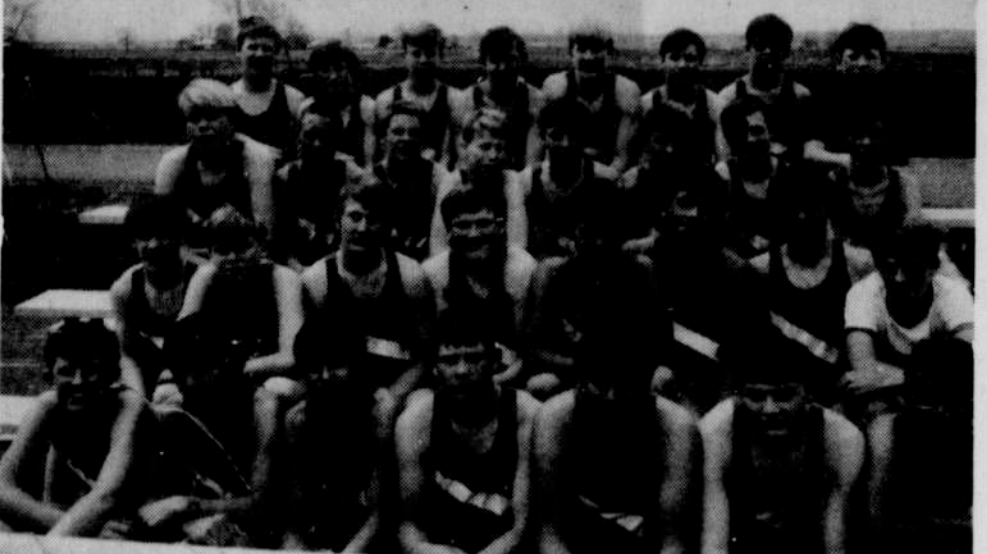

| 8 oz. butter | 4 oz. flour |
| 1/2 oz. shallots or mild dry onion chopped fine | salt and pepper to taste |
| 8 medium mushrooms sliced | 1/2 lb. crab meat |
| 1 lemon | 1/2 lb. shrimps |
| 1 cup dry white wine | 1/2 lb. clams |
| 1 cup milk | 1/2 lb. scallops |
| 1 cup cream | aged Cheddar Cheese |
| 2 egg yolks | Duchesse (mashed potatoes and egg yolk mixed) |

Saute shallots and mushrooms in butter—add seafood and simmer 5 min. Add lemon juice and wine and let simmer 5 min. Add milk and bring to boil. In a separate dish mix 4 oz. flour and 2 oz. melted butter. Mix into boiling ingredients to thicken sauce, then season to taste and lower heat. Be sure the sauce is not boiling, then add beaten cream and egg yolks. Serve on scallop shells or suitable dish and decorate with Duchesse.

Duchesse: Whip mashed potatoes and egg yolks together. Place in pastry bag and decorate around dish filled with Coquilles St. Jacques. Sprinkle each dish with grated cheddar and bake 2 to 3 min. in hot oven until golden brown. Serves 6 to 8.

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Big Bend Irrigation District sitting as a Board of Equalization will meet on the 2nd day of May, 1972 at 8:00 p.m. of said day at the residence of W. C. VanDewater, Secretary, within said District, for the purpose of reviewing and correcting its assessment roll and apportionment of charges for operation, maintenance and construction charges for the 1972-1973 fiscal year. The assessment of \$0.25 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Big Bend Unit of the District. \$0.20 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Park Unit of the District. \$2.75 is levied to meet the construction and rehab charges (as determined by the Secretary of Interior) of the Park Unit of the District for the 1972-1973 fiscal year.

The annual operation and maintenance charges of \$5.80 per acre for the season of 1972 for the Park Unit is the rate set by the Boise Project Board of Control. All water used in excess of 3 1/2 acre feet per acre is \$1.60 per acre foot.

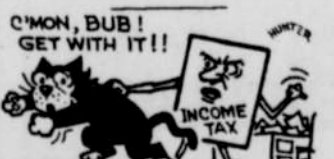
