The Adrian GAA Invitational Track Meet was held April 20. People attending saw the best competition this area has ever seen, with the exception of state meets.

Eighteen schools gathered at Adrian to compete in this meet and totaled a number of 253 girls. Two new girl's school records were set for Adrian by Kathy Hardman, who ran the mile in 6 minutes and 38 seconds, and Nancy Timmerman, who set the new record for the 220 yard dash at 27.9. Nancy competed against state winners from Oregon and Idaho and placed fifth.

SALMON-STEELHEAD LICENSES DUE

Sport fishermen are reminded to return their expired 1971 salmon-steelhead licenses to the Oregon Game Commission as soon as possible. The law requires that these licenses be returned by May 1 following the expiration date.

Reino Koski, who maintains records on angler catch of these fish, advised that the deadline is fast approaching but anglers still have a few days to get these cards back before computation of the 1971 catch begins.

Collection boxes are located at all license agencies for the convenience of fishermen. The cards may also be returned directly to the Game Commission, 1634 S.W. Alder, Portland.

The importance of these record cards cannot be overemphasized, according to Koski. By returning them, sport fishermen will be doing invaluable service toward the management of these important fishery resources. The information provided by anglers is used to compute the statewide salmon and steelhead catch as well as the catch by individual stream.

Total catch figures for 1971 will be available in July. Anglers wanting to know which streams were the top salmon or steelhead producers the past year should contact the Commission at that time.

UPON QUESTION OF LEVYING A TAX OUTSIDE THE LIMITATION OF THE OREGON CONSTITUTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 26 of Malheur County, State of Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on May 15, 1972, at Primary Building in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the question of levying a tax for the fiscal year 1972 - 1973 outside the limitation of Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution.

The reasons for such levy are:

Funding school district operation because the existing tax levy limitation will not produce sufficient funds to operate at state standards for the full school year.

Some of the added expenses are:

Retirement will raise in January 1973 from 5.41% to 7.5%.

Social Security will raise January 1973 from 5.2% on the first \$9000 to 5.65%.

Tuition for Mary Kay School. Increase in school insurance premiums.

Material for a storage building for vocational classes to use until satisfactory facilities can be readied.

Blacktop of more of the elementary playground.

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Big Bend Irrigation District sitting as a Board of Equalization will meet on the 2nd day of May, 1972 at 8:00 p.m. of said day at the residence of W. C. VanDewater, Secretary, within said District, for the purpose of reviewing and correcting its assessment roll and apportionment of charges for operation, maintenance and construction charges for the 1972-1973 fiscal year. The assessment of \$0.25 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Big Bend Unit of the District. \$0.20 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Park Unit of the District. \$2.75 is levied to meet the construction

and rehab charges (as determined by the Secretary of Interior) of the Park Unit of the District for the 1972-1973 fiscal year.

The annual operation and maintenance charges of \$5.80 per acre for the season of 1972 for the Park Unit is the rate set by the Boise Project Board of Control. All water used in excess of 3 1/2 acre feet per acre is \$1.60 per acre foot. The assessment roll and record may be inspected by any interested persons at the office of the Secretary.
