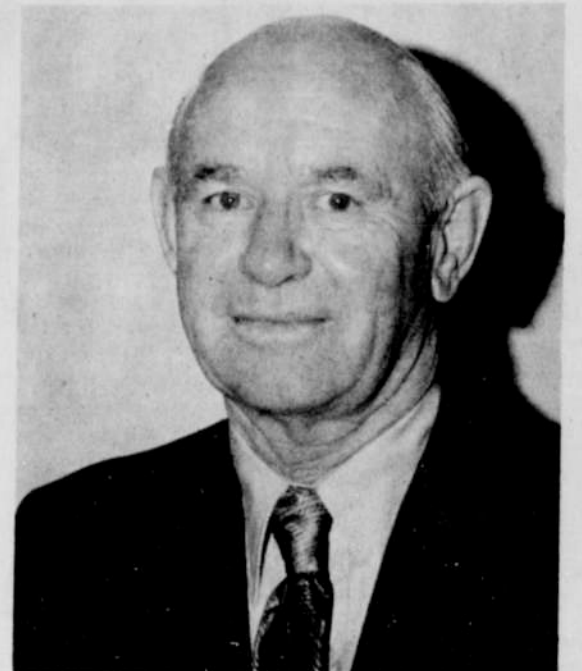

- Worked at local, state and federal level for recognition of Malheur County and Eastern Oregon needs, testifying before legislative and congressional hearings.
- Knowledgeable and acquainted with public officials to better serve Malheur County.
- Brought about basic bills in Congress 'In lieu tax payments on Federally owned tax immune lands where 4,619,000 acres of BLM land in Malheur County, at 10 cents per acre, will provide \$461,900 income per year.
- Advocates revenue sharing of Federal income tax with state and local government. This bill passed the House Ways and Means Committee. Both the above items would be tax offsets.
- Supported and worked with 4-H, FFA, and other youth groups.
- Supports a south truck by-pass for Ontario, keeping trucks off 4th Avenue; the Nyssa Locust Street truck by-pass, and the Vale Airport road improvement.
- Advocates Succor Creek road, the Mitchell Butte bridge over the Owyhee, the Farm Labor Bill, Malheur Experiment Station and predatory animal control.
- Past president, Oregon Juvenile Judges Association, (Seven and one half years juvenile judge) Association of Oregon Counties.
- President 13 state Western Region of Counties. Co-chairman, National Association of Counties Public Lands Committee and director, NAOCC.
- Governmental appointee to Oregon Law Enforcement Council.
- Distinguished citizen award by Idaho Daily Statesman.
- Member of the Methodist Church, a Mason, an Elk, and an FFA honorary member.
- An active participant in progressive programs for orderly growth while maintaining a liveable Malheur County.
