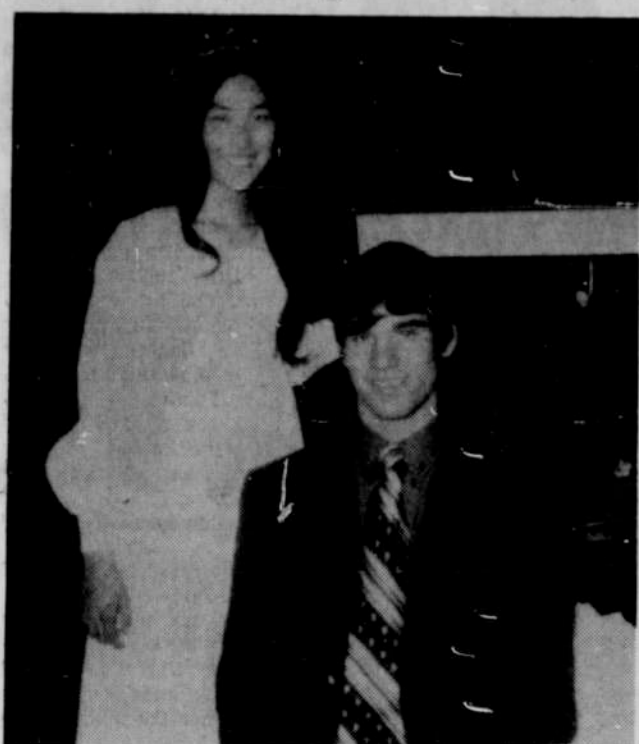


## Royalty Reigns At Prom

## Beethoven

### Concert May 8

"An Evening With John Logar," an all-Beethoven piano concert, will be presented by John Logar of Tucson, Arizona at the Ontario High School auditorium on the evening of May 8 beginning at 7:30 o'clock. The concert is being sponsored by the Vale Music Teacher's Association.

Born in 1937 in St. Paul, Minnesota, Logar studied with Ella Richards, a student of Theodore Leschitsky, the great piano pedagogue of the last century.

To finance his musical education, Logar has worked at diversified occupations: national park ranger, counselor and teacher of the handicapped, construction worker, cross country truck driver and church custodian.

Rev. Edmond Fern, co-pastor of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, will introduce Logar at the concert. Father Fern, an accomplished musician himself, said the concert will be very valuable for music students as the pianist's technique is very good.

Father Fern's and Logar's friendship dates back many years to when they met at Mt. Angel where Logar's brother is a monk. His parents live in Los Angeles, California.

Admission charges for the evening will be \$1.50 per adults and 50 cents for children. Refreshments will be served at intermission by members of the A. A. U. W.
