**Bank Debits**

Bank debits for the 8 reporting banks including Harney and Malheur counties were down in March, 1972, compared to March, 1971; the University of Oregon Bureau of Business and Economic Research has reported.

Debits for March, 1972, totaled \$58,126,000. For February, 1972, the total was \$51,298,000 and for March, 1971, the total was \$60,110,000. Oregon with 392 banks reporting had a percentage increase of 13.1% in March, 1972, as compared with February, 1972, and a 15.9 percentage increase in March, 1972, compared with March, 1971.

Total bank debits for March 1972, came to \$6,229,070,000. For February, 1972, the total was \$5,509,101,000 and for March, 1971, the total was \$5,374,544,000.
