The total operating budget for TVCC for the 1972-73 school year is \$2,611,788. \$621,972, the district's share of that amount, (less than 25% of the cost), was already passed in a special election by the voters in February. The major part of the operating budget generates from state funds, federal funds, student tuition, and student fees.

Why A Tax Base

✓ Our College District (most of Malheur County and Huntington) is a geographic area where people live together with many common goals for the purpose of making a good life for themselves, their families and neighbors. With a good education program for all peoples of all ages we can better understand and enjoy our lives and relationship with others. With a tax base the TVCC elected board of directors can better carry on the work of education without having to sell the basic programs over and over each year.

✓ A tax base will eliminate the cost and confusion of special elections every year for normal operating costs.

✓ A tax base does not give the college a "blank check." There will still be a budget committee composed of 14 taxpayers who must approve the budget. There will still be public budget hearings and publication of the budget for information of the voters.
