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Litter Control Program Starts June 5

The Oregon State Highway Division will launch the 1972 Youth Litter Control Program on June 5, it was announced today by George Baldwin, administrator of highways.

Funds obtained from the sale of customized license plates will be utilized to finance the program, Baldwin said, with approximately \$80,000 being available. The program will run through August 25. It will be divided into two six-week periods with different crews operating during the second half to provide employment opportunities for a greater number of youngsters.

The first period will extend from June 5 to July 14. Crews will be stationed at Sylvan, Milwaukie, Banfield, Astoria, Woodburn, Salem, Albany, New-

port, Corvallis, Eugene, Roseburg, Coquille, Medford, The Dalles, Bend, Klamath Falls, Pendleton, and LaGrande. The second period will extend from July 17 through August 25. This time teams will operate from Sylvan, Milwaukie, Banfield, Tillamook, McMinnville, Salem, Albany, Eugene, Reedsport, Roseburg, Grants Pass, Medford, Klamath Falls, Prineville, Hood River, Pendleton, Baker, and Ontario.

Basically the program will operate as it did during its inaugural year with 18 four-member teams being organized to work in various parts of the state. All applications for employment will be processed through the State Employment Division with the applicants being sent to the Highway District Engineer offices where the actual hiring will be done.

Participants must be between 16 and 20 years of age. They will receive \$1.74 per hour.

Crew chiefs, who will receive \$2.21 per hour, must be between 18 and 20 years of age, have a valid driver's license, and approved driving record.

Safety will be stressed in performing the work required, including the wearing of hard hats and vests, staying off the traveled roadway, crossing the roadway, and other similar safety measures. The crews will pick up the roadside litter in plastic bags. State dump trucks and personnel will collect and dispose of the filled bags.

Baldwin pointed out that in addition to financing the Youth Litter Control Program, funds from the sale of the customized license plates are also used to sponsor the SOLV and "Keep Oregon Liveable" environmental educational program.

A summary of the permanent traffic recorder data for rural and urban state highways showed an increase of 6.7 percent in vehicular traffic in February, 1972, compared to February, 1971.

The first two months of 1972 showed an increase of 8.6 percent in vehicular traffic compared to the first two months of 1971.
