Jennings, Junior Queen, of Ontario.

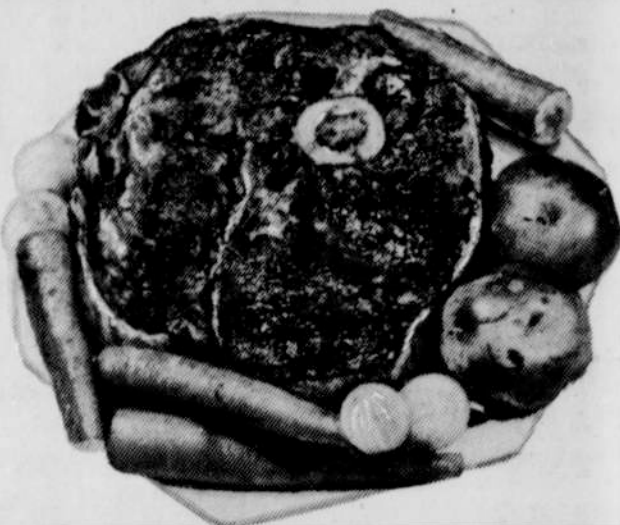
