**OSU Graduation GRADUATES AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS**

**Planned June 4**

Oregon State University will graduate its 103rd class Sunday, June 4. The number of degrees to be conferred this year will approach 3,500 compared to 3 in 1870, according to Registrar Wallace E. Gibbs.

The colorful commencement program is scheduled for 2 p.m. in Gill Coliseum.

Ticket-holding parents and other relatives are expected to fill the 10,000 seats of the Coliseum but the graduation exercises will be televised again this year by KOAP-TV, Channel 10, Portland, and KOAC-TV, Channel 7, Corvallis, so thousands of others can watch.

The number of bachelor's degrees conferred by the university passed the 50,000 mark last year and the master's degree total will reach 10,000 this June.

The Oregon Scholarship Commission has notified Mr. Buchtel, guidance counselor, that state scholarships and grants will be let on May 19. Since many students will have been graduated before they know what scholarships and grants they have received for next year, the following list of winners are only those known at this time. 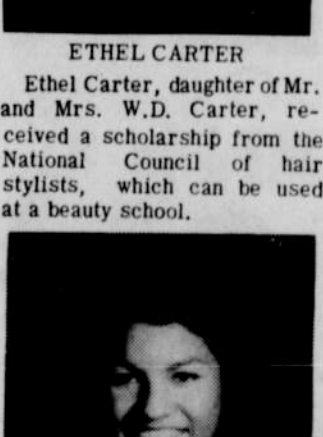

Nettie Alonzo, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ramon Alonzo, will receive a grant from TVCC and a community college grant to TVCC.



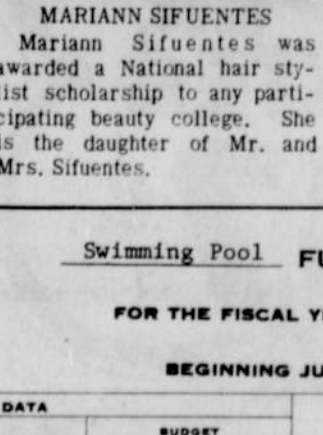
MARLENE JAMIESON

Mariann Sifuentes was awarded a National hair stylist scholarship to any participating beauty college. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sifuentes.



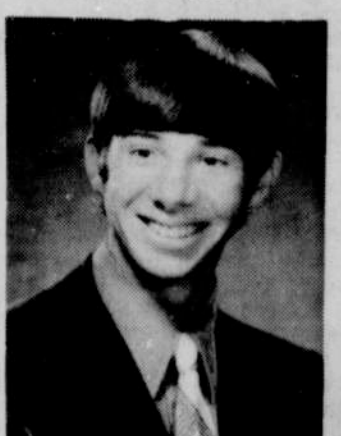
SCOTT ENGSTROM
