

### Sen. Packwood Seeks Service Applications

Senator Bob Packwood (R-Ore.) today announced he now is accepting applications to Annapolis, West Point, Air Force and Merchant Marine academies for classes entering in July, 1973. Deadline for applying is November 30, 1972.

To be eligible, applicants must be between the ages of 17 and 21 and have completed high school by July 1, 1972. Nominees are chosen on a strictly competitive basis. Those interested in attending one of the four service academies should write to Packwood as soon as possible to obtain the necessary application forms. Packwood selects the ten highest-ranking applicants to each of the four academies. His nominees are then turned over to the academies for appointment.

Packwood will announce his nominees for appointment to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y., the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., and U. S. Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs, Colo., and the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, N.Y., in January.
