

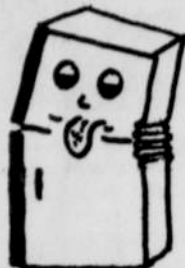
Injured Man Helped

VICKI'S CREAMY ORANGE MILK DRINK

3/4 cup (6-oz. can) frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed
1/2 pint vanilla ice cream
3 cups milk
Top with scoop of ice cream. In a mixer or blender beat orange juice concentrate with ice cream and milk until smooth. Serve icy cold. 4 servings.

ROYAL ALASKA PIE

Pie plate, 9-inch

CRUST

1 cup regular all-purpose flour
3 tablespoons confectioners sugar
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, softened
1/3 cup finely chopped nuts

FILLING

2 pints cherry ice cream, softened
1 pint vanilla ice cream, softened
Meringue

Crust: Beat together flour, sugar, butter. Add nuts. Press into pie plate; build-up edge; prick. In preheated 350 degree oven bake 15-18 minutes. Chill. Filling: Pack 1 pint cherry ice cream into crust; freeze. Repeat with remaining ice cream. Freeze. Immediately before serving, top with meringue; seal to crust. Place on board; bake in preheated 500 degree oven 1-3 minutes.

MERINGUE

6 egg whites, at room temperature
3/4 cup sugar
Beat egg whites just until frothy. Continue beating while sprinkling sugar, a tablespoon at a time, over egg whites. Continue beating until stiff peaks form.

Responsibility Of Tenant Noted By Realtors

"Any revision of owner-tenant law must reflect a new legal responsibility; that of the tenant to maintain and care for the property," John Vincent president of Malheur County Board of Realtors stated today.

Prompted to comment by the controversy over the proposed "Model Residential Landlord-Tenant Code," Realtor Vincent noted that rights given each party under basic contract law should not be abrogated for the purpose of creating causes of action which could be used for harassment. "Any reform of the owner-tenant laws must contain safeguards to provide for the protection of the owner's investment as well as a remedy for a tenant's grievance."

"However, it must also insure that the conscientious owner is not penalized by the practices of the wrong-doer," he continued.

The proposed model code will be discussed in San Francisco, June 9, by the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.

Realtor Vincent also commented that Realtors in Malheur County view with alarm the "proliferation" of rent control laws and other legislation which inhibit the right of open contracts between parties, and discourage the construction of new rental units necessary to meet the national housing goals.
