The Federated Garden Clubs of Oregon will hold their State Convention on the TVCC Campus, June 12-15. Malheur District No. 11 will host the convention. All Garden Club members of the area are urged to attend any or all of these three days of entertaining and informative garden oriented programs. Registration may be made through a local garden club.

Speakers giving short programs during the convention days will be Jeff Ford, from the TVCC faculty, speaking as a representative of the Malheur Historical Society; G.R. Gurr, district manager of the BLM, speaking on "The Public Domain and the Environment"; and Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Staender of Sisters, Oregon, authors of a recently published book "Adventures with Artic Wildlife", speaking on their life in Alaska.

Wednesday evening, June 14 the program will be open to the public featuring Claude W. Mills, noted horticulturist, and the Pobanz singers, starting at 7:30 p.m. in the TVCC gym. Tickets are available either in advance from Garden Club members or at the door for \$2 each.

Claude Mills has 27 years experience with major national seed, plant and chemical suppliers to his credit. He is currently a horticulturist teacher at Clackamas Community College. Through his work with the Oregon Association of Nurserymen he has endeavored to promote beauty through the use of Oregon-grown materials. Combining his rich knowledge of the history of Oregon's native and domestic flora with the photographer's love of the pastoral, Mills has assembled from his travels, 2,200 volume library of Northwest species and a color slide presentation that will appeal to all.

On Thursday evening, June 15, a noted flower arranger, Barbara Hepler, will give a demonstration entitled "Spring Treasures". Tickets to the public for this will also be \$2 each. An informal reception will be held after Mrs. Hepler's program.

Barbara Hepler is a nationally accredited amateur flower show judge and landscape design critic, and was Idaho's recipient of the Arranger of the Year Award in 1968 and 1969. She has presented lectures, demonstrations and workshops, throughout Idaho and adjacent states. She is a charter member and first president of the Hill and Valley Garden Club, Kendrick, Idaho; immediate past district director of the Clearwater District and is now first vice-president of the Idaho State Federation of Garden Clubs.

As a farm wife on a dry land wheat ranch in north central Idaho, she became interested in all facets of horticulture, especially the culture of daffodils and chrysanthemums. She grows much of the material she uses in her arrangements and believes that the artistic use of plants is the most satisfying expression of garden club work.
