Bank Debits Down In April

Bank debits for the eight reporting banks including Harney and Malheur counties were down in April, 1972, compared to April, 1971; the University of Oregon Bureau of Business and Economic Research has reported. Debits for April, 1972, totaled \$55,320,000. For March, 1972, the total was \$58,216,000 and for April, 1971, the total was \$57,643,000. Oregon with 392 banks reporting had a percentage decrease of 5.3% in April, 1972, as compared with March, 1972, and a 4.7 percentage increase in April, 1972, compared with April, 1971. Total bank debits for April, 1972, came to \$5,898,258,000. For March, 1972, the total was \$6,229,070,000 and for April, 1971, the total was \$5,535,727,000.
