Princess Vicki's Strawberry Blonde Sundae

Into sundae dish put 1/2 ounce sliced or crushed fresh or frozen strawberries. Top with 3 scoops of vanilla ice cream.

Cover with 1 ounce strawberries. Drizzle lemon sauce over berries to taste.



Baskin-Robbins Famous Triple Treat Sundae

In a sundae dish place one large scoop each of chocolate mint, jamoca almond fudge and burgundy cherry ice cream.

Cover chocolate mint ice cream with marshmallow sauce, jamoca almond fudge with chocolate sauce, and burgundy cherry with pineapple sauce.

Sprinkle with toasted almonds and garnish with 3 maraschino cherries.



Lemon Sundae Sauce: 2 cups sugar, 1/2 cup lemon juice, 2 teaspoons grated lemon rind, 3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) real butter, 4 eggs, beaten slightly.

In a saucepan combine sugar, lemon juice and rind; add butter. Cook over low heat until butter melts and sugar dissolves.

When the city's pious element protested naming the dish after the Sabbath, the spelling was changed to "Sundae."
