#### YOUR RIGHTS AS A CITIZEN

Every person enjoys certain rights set forth in the United States Constitution and protected by law. Listed here are but a few of these important rights. In order to fully appreciate them, however, and understand our heritage of individual freedom under the law, we must know these rights and the corresponding responsibilities that go with them.

Your rights under law include:

- The right to equal justice in our courts and equal protection of the laws.
- The right to have legal counsel of your choice and a prompt trial if accused of crime.
- The right to be free from arbitrary search or arrest.
- The right to choose public officers in free elections.
- The right to free speech, press and assembly.
- The right to own property.
- The right to equal educational and economic opportunity.
- The right to attend the church of your choice.

#### YOUR DUTY AS A CITIZEN

With your rights as a citizen of the United States of America go individual responsibilities. Every citizen shares them. Only by fulfilling our whole duty as responsible citizens can we strengthen our country and its institutions.

Your duties as a citizen include:

- The duty to respect, obey and uphold the laws.
- The duty to be informed on issues of government and community affairs.
- The duty to vote in elections.
- The duty to practice and teach the principles of good citizenship in your home.
- The duty to serve on juries if called.
- The duty to support agencies of law enforcement.
- The duty to honor the rights of others.
- The duty of allegiance to the Constitution of the United States of America and to work for its betterment and continuation.

### John Beck Attends New Principals Workshop

John M. Beck spent last week (May 30-June 2) on the campus of Brigham Young University attending a workshop for new principals in preparation for his assignment as principal of the Prescott, Arizona Seminary, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. This is Mr. Beck's first assignment with the Department of Seminaries and Institutes of Religion. He is a graduate of Nyssa High School.

The four-day workshop consisted of concentrated orientation in all phases of the responsibilities of principalship. Addressing the group formally were

Dr. Joe J. Christensen, Associate Commissioner of Education, as well as his assistant administrators -- Dr. Franklin D. Day, Dr. Dan J. Workman, and Dr. Frank M. Bradshaw. In addition to classroom sessions, a banquet was held in the Ernest L. Wilkinson Center on Thursday. Instruction is given on a high school level in Old Testament, New Testament, Book of Mormon, and LDS Church History on a rotating basis. The course of study for the 1972-73 school year throughout the entire system will be the New Testament.

### OUT OF THE PAST

#### 10 YEARS AGO

Michael Pratt and Kiyoharu Hori, Adrian High School students, will leave this week to attend Junior Engineer and Scientist Summer Institute in Corvallis. The two-week session will be held at Oregon State University.

The Adrian students were recipients of tuition fees presented by American Federation of Grain Millers, local No. 290.

This award is given annually to students in one of the area schools. Two years ago the tuition gift went to Nyssa students.

An estimated crowd of 400 area residents and guests were present at formal ceremonies held Sunday afternoon at the Nyssa municipal swimming pool.

The pool was officially dedicated by City Councilman Maylin Maxfield in the absence of Mayor Grant Rinehart who recently underwent surgery.

#### 20 YEARS AGO

The new road into Owyhee reservoir, being built entirely with donated funds and some volunteer labor and equipment, is progressing satisfactorily and will be open for traffic within a few weeks Ken Renstrom reported. Most of the road has been cut over the grade after it leaves the Succor Creek road. Donations for the work are coming in from a wide area, Renstrom said. One contribution of \$602 was made by members of the Adrian Lions Club.

Bernard Frost, district manager of the Idaho Power Co. at Nyssa, will move to Payette about August 1 to

assume the position as manager of the company's western division which comprises 11 offices and towns in Oregon and Idaho.

#### 30 YEARS AGO

The Nyssa rationing board today announced that applications for sugar for fruit canning will be received each Wednesday in the City Hall.

A woman must have with her an inventory of the number of quarts of fruit canned in 1941, the quarts she now has on hand and all of her family's sugar rationing books.

Home canners may obtain one pound of sugar for every four quarts of finished canned fruit, and an additional pound of sugar for each member of the family unit for the packing of preserves, jams, jellies and fruit butters.

Members of the Nazarene Church will hold their first meeting in their new church Sunday morning at 10 o'clock. The building is not completed but it will be finished as soon as possible. Dedication of the building will be held within the next few weeks.

#### 40 YEARS AGO

Mrs. Elizabeth A. Doty, aged 102 years, one of the oldest, if not the oldest matron in Malheur County, died Sunday in Ontario at the home of her son E.P. Smiley, 82.

Instead of marching down the steps in the fire drill of yesterday, Nyssa students will make a more rapid and modern exit next term by sliding down a spiral and incline fire escape. The new fire escapes, an incline shoot and steel spiral were ordered by the Oregon fire marshal and installed last week. They are located on the

east and north side and provide exit from the second and third stories.

#### 50 YEARS AGO

Reports from nearby towns say that the Rocky Mountain Warblers (Morris Entertainers and Male Quartette) are about the best attraction of its kind ever seen in these parts.
