The contest, a dinner event, begins at 8 p.m. in the Eastside cafe in Ontario, according to Mrs. Joe (Scotty) Payne of Vale, a member of the sponsoring Malheur County Dairy Wives club.

Mrs. Payne said there is an advance sale of contest tickets at \$2.50 per person which includes the dinner and tickets may be purchased from any of the sponsors and the contestants. Mrs. Payne said she hoped that, to insure proper preparation, most who would be attending would purchase their tickets by Thursday, (today) June 22.

The three contestants this year are Terrilyn Chamberlain of Nyssa, Leona Musgrove of Vale and Jenny Kennington of Ontario. Each will present a three-minute talk, song or verse which may be either serious or humorous concerning the dairy industry or its products.
