Older Meat Is Best Buy

The best meat buy? Whatever the butcher wants to sell -- and that often is meat sold at a reduced price because it has lost the bright red color that makes it appealing.

This meat is the best bargain around. It is more tender and just as nutritional and tasty as the more attractive appearing meat," said OSU animal scientist and meat lab supervisor W.H. Kennick.

Taste tests conducted at OSU Mrs. Clyde Bowers Monday morning.

rank the older meat equal to that of the fresher cuts, dispelling the fallacy that this meat is not good, said Kennick.

In a study to determine the role certain variables play in the meataging process, Kennick and fellow researchers found that degree of marbling influences the oxidation process responsible for the bright red and later the darker color in meat. The highest degree of marbling increased the oxidation process.

"This means fat is a catalyst to the oxidizing process and that prime beef with more marbling will not last as long in the display case as choice grade beef," said Kennick.

"Most retailers consider themselves lucky if meat holds its bloom in the display case more than three days," he added, explaining that proper sanitation and temperature control practices can prolong the case life of meat.

Attempts to preserve meat by freezing at the retail level have failed because the consumer wants fresh meat and generally refuses to buy frozen cuts, said Kennick.

"Yet the housewife will buy fresh meat at the market and take it home and freeze it herself in the freezing compartment of her refrigerator which usually has inadequate temperature for freezing meat,"
