Deadline Near For Game Tags

Big game hunters interested in antelope, bighorn sheep, or the Jackson and Josephine agricultural deer seasons are reminded that time is running out if they intend to file for these hunts and be included in the drawings. Late applications will be processed only if surplus tags or permits remain.

According to rules adopted by the Game Commission, nimbros have until July 11 to submit applications. The drawing to determine successful applicants will be held July 21. Applications received after the July 11 deadline will not be included in the drawings.

A total of 1,430 antelope tags is authorized for 16 antelope hunting units. Fifty tags will also be issued to archers in the Gerber Reservoir area. The antelope season is scheduled August 19 through 23.

Thirteen bighorn sheep tags will be issued, five for the Hart Mountain area and eight for the Steens. Split seasons are scheduled for bighorn sheep: September 16 through 22 in the Steens and September 23 through 29 at Hart Mountain.

A total of 1,500 permits is authorized for the two agricultural deer hunts, 750 for each. The Jackson and Josephine agricultural seasons are scheduled August 12 through October 6 and November 6 through November 30.

Oregon Cattlemen Resist Foreign Beef

The nation's cattlemen express dismay and disappointment over President Nixon's decision to lift all restrictions on foreign meat imports for the remainder of the year, according to Charley Otley, President, Oregon Cattlemen's Association.

Otley, along with other OCA officers, is meeting in Denver this week with the Board of Directors of the American National Cattlemen's Association.

The OCA President said that the administration action would see little or no results for the consumer as far as beef prices are concerned, at the retail level. It's the cattle producer who will suffer. It seems cattlemen are being made the scapegoat of this country's continuing inflation.

John Trotman, President, American National Cattlemen's Association, told beef industry leader Monday (June 26) that "if this nations cattlemen were to gear their operations profit motive to the same traditional cost-plus methods used by America's businesses and industries, the cost of beef today would be beyond the reach of the consumer." Trotman also said that President Nixon's action sets a dangerous precedent "because of unlimited for-

sign beef the United States could have a beef over-supply situation for years to come. Thus, the nation's cattlemen could suffer a severe financial loss, to the extent of putting individual cattlemen out of business."

OCA Executive Vice President Donald Ostensoe said from Denver, "The consumer must be made very aware that foreign beef is no where near the high quality and wholesomeness of domestic beef." Ostensoe also said that "Meat inspection and health requirements of foreign meat do not come near the requirements of the United States beef inspection."

The mood in Denver was quite obvious, Oregon and the nation's cattlemen definitely showed an air of concern and disappointment in regards to President Nixon's lifting the restrictions on beef imports.
