

COLUMBIA STURGEON MAKES UNUSUAL TRIP

A Columbia River sturgeon tagged by the Washington Department of Fisheries April 8 near Reed Island made a quick but unusual trip before it was caught and prepared for the table 52 days later.

According to John Haxton, fishery biologist for the Oregon Game Commission in the lower Columbia district, the 43-inch, 19-pound sturgeon made a leisurely trip to Bonneville Dam after being tagged, where it was caught on May 14 by Jim Harp of Hillsboro. Harp recorded the tag number and then released the fish back into the Columbia.

Evidently the sturgeon, stung once by net and once by hook and line, didn't like the man-handling received in the Bonneville area so headed downstream looking for safer water and chose the Willamette as a site for a new home. But his eagerness to bite spelled his doom just two weeks later, May 30, when John Buxman of Portland hooked and beached the fish under the West Linn

Bridge. Haxton said that the recovery of the tagged sturgeon is unusual in two respects. First, the fact that the sturgeon moved from Bonneville Dam to Oregon City in two weeks time is a rapid migration rate for this species. Secondly, of over 1,400 sturgeon tagged in the Columbia River by the Game Commission since 1965, plus those tagged by other fishery agencies, this is the first record of one moving from the Columbia into the upstream Willamette area. Three sturgeon tagged in the Columbia have been recovered along the north coast of Washington.

Yellowstone Bear Shot

A 400-pound female grizzly bear that apparently killed a camper here was trapped and killed by park rangers early today.

Rangers said the animal was being shipped to Bozeman, Montana for an autopsy.

The bear was described as old and possibly ill. It was snared near the campsite where Harry Walker, 25, Anniston, Alabama was killed early Sunday. Rangers said the bear had been tagged and moved to more remote areas of the park following earlier trouble-making incidents.

Walker was killed when he startled the animal with a flashlight as it was eating food Walker and a companion had left lying on the ground at their camp.

Park officials said Walker and Phillip Bradberry, Oxford, Alabama had camped in a restricted area near Old Faithful Geyser. Bradberry was not injured but was being treated for shock after watching his friend being mauled to death.

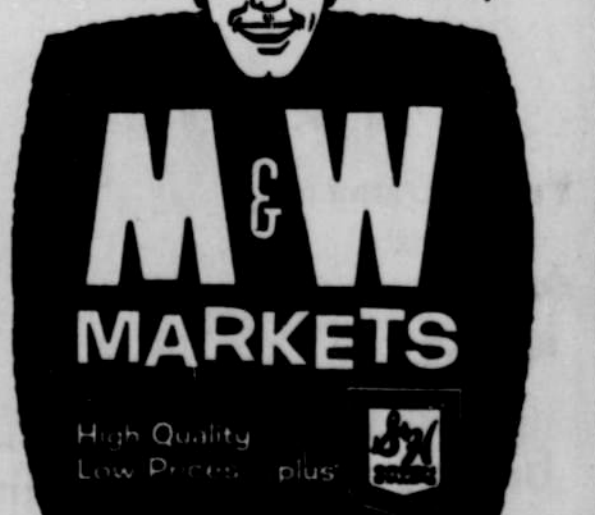
