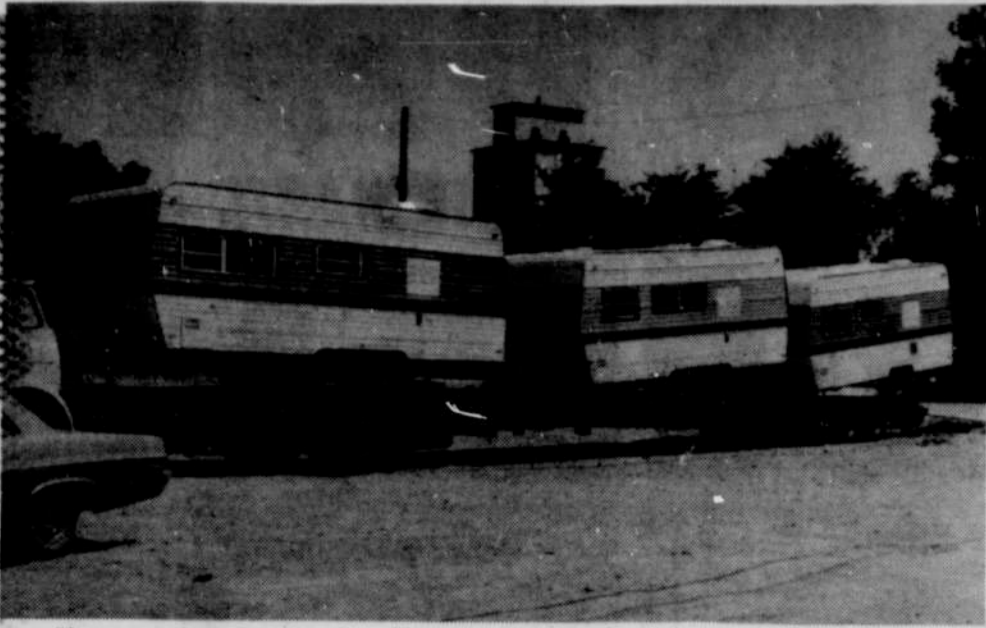


New Recreational Vehicles Unloaded
