Frozen jams are popular among old and young alike. Mom likes them because they're so easy to prepare -- Dad because they're so good with their natural flavor. This is the recipe I like best for frozen jams.

FROZEN FRUIT "JAMS"

Prepare fruit by mashing very fine or putting through sieve. Measure fruit and add sugar; let stand about 20

minutes, stirring occasionally. Stir 1 package powdered pectin into 1 cup water, bring to a boil and boil rapidly for one minute stirring constantly. (To use liquid pectin, omit the powdered pectin and water, and use 1/2 cup of liquid pectin. No cooking necessary.) Remove from heat and add the fruit, stirring for about two minutes. Pour into freezer containers. Cover and let stand at room temperature until jelled. Seal and freeze.

KIND OF JAM	AMOUNT OF FRUIT	SUGAR
Apricot	2 cups (add 1 tsp powdered citric acid)	4 cups
Blackberry	3 cups	5 1/2 cups
Cherry	2 cups	4 cups
Grape	3 cups (simmer to soften skins - then sieve)	6 cups
Peach	2 cups (add 1 tsp. powdered citric acid)	4 cups
Plum, Prune	2 cups	4 cups
Plum, tart	3 cups	6 cups
Raspberry, black	2 cups	4 cups
Raspberry, red	3 cups	6 cups
Strawberry	2 cups	4 cups

Have you wondered how strawberries got their name? Some think they trace their name to the straw that was placed between the rows of berries in order to keep them clean and protect the plants. This would have been useful last week when we had our flash floods.

Strawberries are high in Vitamin C. They're delicious to taste and easy to prepare, as indicated by this recipe.

STRAWBERRY DELIGHT

- 1 1/2 cups vanilla wafer crumbs
- 3/4 cup soft butter
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs, separated
- 1 quart sliced, fresh straw-

berries or 3 10-oz. packages frozen strawberries (thawed and drained)

1/2 cup sliced walnuts or almonds

1 1/2 cups heavy cream, whipped

Spread half of crumbs in 12x9x2 inch pan. With electric mixer at medium speed, cream butter with sugar and extracts. Add egg yolks, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry; fold into butter mixture; drop over crumbs, making a thin layer. Spoon on a layer of berries; sprinkle with nuts. Spread with whipped cream and sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Refrigerate 24 hours. Serves 12 to 16.
