Charles Flynn tallied 19 for the winners. Greg Blanch paced the Easy Riders with 17 tallies.

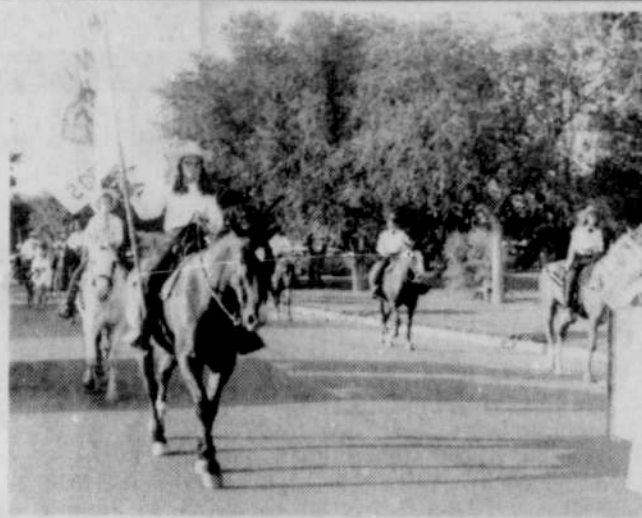
RIDERS WIN IN OVERTIME

Jeff Marquez paced the Easy Riders with 17 points. Allen Eisenbarth contributed 15 to the Gazelle effort.

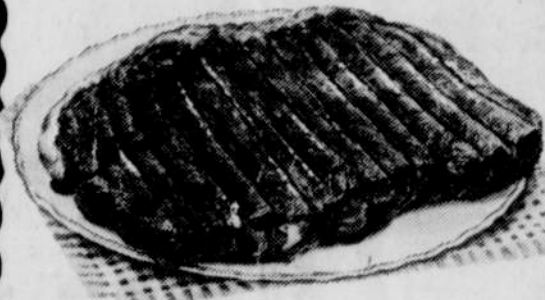
