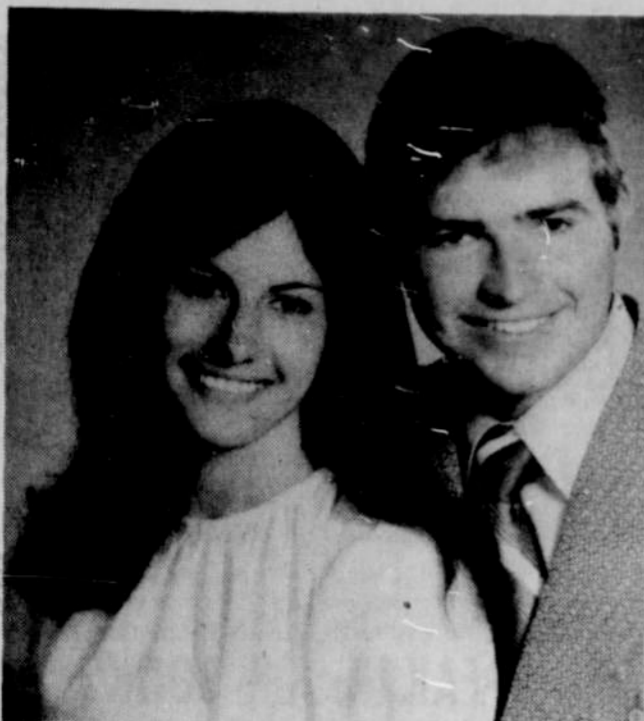


### Engagement Announced

### TVCC Board Adds Two New Members

Oaths of office were administered to new members, John Bishop and Aranka Trenkel at the TVCC Board of Directors meeting July 5. 1972-73 officers were elected: Chairman, Sherman Turner; Vice-Chairman, Wayne Ball. James Roberts and Sara Hull were appointed deputy clerks.

The board approved maintenance of fidelity bonds of \$10,000 on all business office employees, the clerk and deputy clerks; an additional \$40,000 on the Business Manager and \$15,000 on the Bookstore Manager.

The Business Manager was designated Custodian of district funds. The signatures of Business Manager and Board Chairman, or Business Manager and Vice-Chairman, or the signature plate alone was authorized for check signatures.

Western Bank of Ontario was continued as the repository of funds. Designation of the auditor for 1972-73 was postponed to the next meeting. The Board passed a resolution authorizing short term borrowing for college operation not to exceed \$130,000. A City of Ontario request for 40 feet of road right-of-way on the west side of the gym and for a sewer extension which should eventually permit drainage of the gym parking lot was approved.

The Board authorized the administration to open bids for a Food Service freezer unit at 2:00 p.m., July 10 and to make the award if not in excess of a \$3500 limit set by the Board.

Next meeting will be July 23.
