### PIGEON AND DOVE

The Oregon Game Commission has adopted regulations for the taking of band-tailed pigeons and mourning doves for 1972 with the season on

both birds scheduled from September 1 through September 30. These regulations were discussed previously at the big game regulations hearing in June but final adoption was delayed until the federal

regulatory framework on these migratory birds was received. Bag limit for pigeons is 8 per day, 8 in possession. Bag limit on mourning doves is 10 per day, 20 in possession. Regulations for the taking of

other upland game birds, waterfowl, and furbearing animals will be set by the Commission following a public hearing scheduled August 12. At that time full information will be avail-

able to the Commission on the status of the bird populations. Recommendations from the public will also be heard and given consideration in the deliberations. The public meeting will be

held at the Commission's Portland headquarters, 1634 SW Alder, and will convene at 10 a.m. All interested persons are invited to attend and express their views.
