Sunday, Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Osborn and family of Big Bend were dinner guests in the Myron Osborn home.

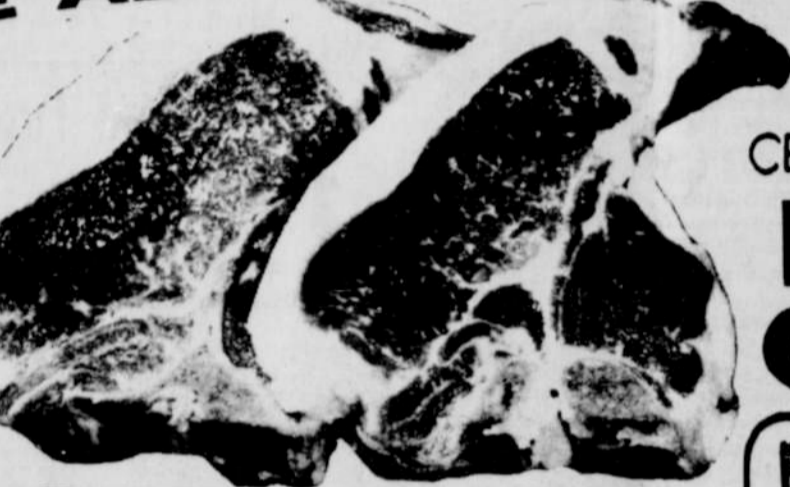
