Before returning home, they visited Mr. and Mrs. George Eichner at Harrisburg and Mr. and Mrs. Fred Mull of Oakridge.

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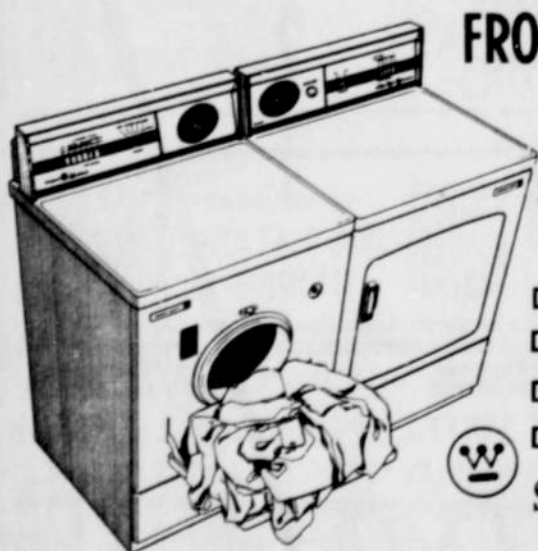
