The reserve champion beef, consigned by Gary DeLong, Vale, went to the Mountain View Equipment Company, Nyssa for \$69 cwt or \$623.40. The sale saw 78 steers, 91 lambs and 26 hogs sold for a total of \$41,218.67. The 1971 sale brought \$36,027,67. The 78 steers brought \$33,526 for an average of \$44.01 per cwt. Last year's average was \$40.49.
