UP NOTICEABLY

Grain movement at the ports of Portland and Astoria picked up sharply in August with grain exports jumping from 136,132 tons in July to 210,480 tons in August.

Protein analysis made in the laboratory of the Grain Division of the Oregon Department of Agriculture, however, held about even.

At Pendleton the department's inspection figures showed a proportionate increase in grain movement during August with 5,272 tons of grain inspected and weighed.
