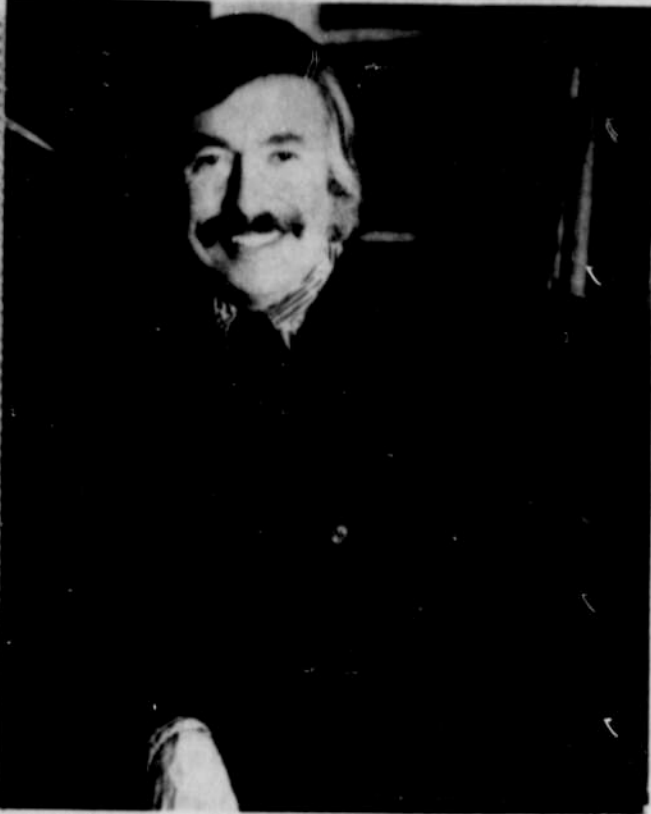


Community Concert October 10



OUTSTANDING AS A SUCCESSFUL PIANO ARTIST and composer, Mr. Neil Wolfe, brings his jazz trio to the Ontario High School Auditorium on Tuesday, October 10, at 8:15 p.m. He has captured the imagination of his listening public by his memorable arrangements of popular and show tunes, as well as his own compositions, some of which have been written for the great Barbara Streisand. His friendship with and encouragement from Miss Streisand spurred him on to reach the heights in the pop piano field. They have several recordings on Columbia label together.

He insisted on piano lessons at the age of seven, to the surprise of his non-musical parents, commenting after his initial recording - "He'd probably have to get them a record-player so they could hear it!" He continued study at the University of Syracuse and at New England Conservatory, majoring in composition. Experience in night-club playing, led to his discovery by Columbia and Columbia Artists, with whom he is now in his fourth sold-out season. He is supported by string-bass and percussion.

A lively musical evening is in store for patrons of the Malheur Community Concert Association. 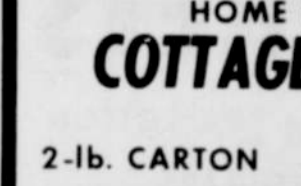

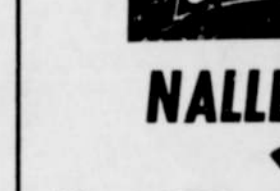

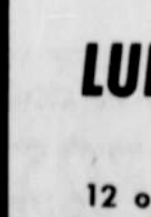
