Speaker Against Increased Spending

Oregon House Speaker Bob Smith of Burns said Friday he will not support any tax reform measure which includes revenues to increase government spending.

Smith said the 1973 Legislature will face a decision on which of several alternatives can best meet the goals outlined in Portland Friday by Gov. Tom McCall.

"I can wholeheartedly support the concepts and the goals contained in the Governor's message," Smith said, "but it remains to be seen which of several alternatives can best meet these goals."

Smith said any tax reform proposal must measure up in three critical areas:

--It must provide significant property tax relief;

--It must allow us to retain strong local control of primary and secondary education;

--It must apply new revenues exclusively as an offset to property taxes, and must not contain any money for increases in government spending.

Smith said "a program which addresses itself to these concerns in the most fair and equitable manner will have my support."

He said he still favors a hold-the-line policy on state taxation, and that vigorous budget-cutting will be required by the next Legislature to guarantee that state government continues to live within the means of the taxpayers who finance its operation.
