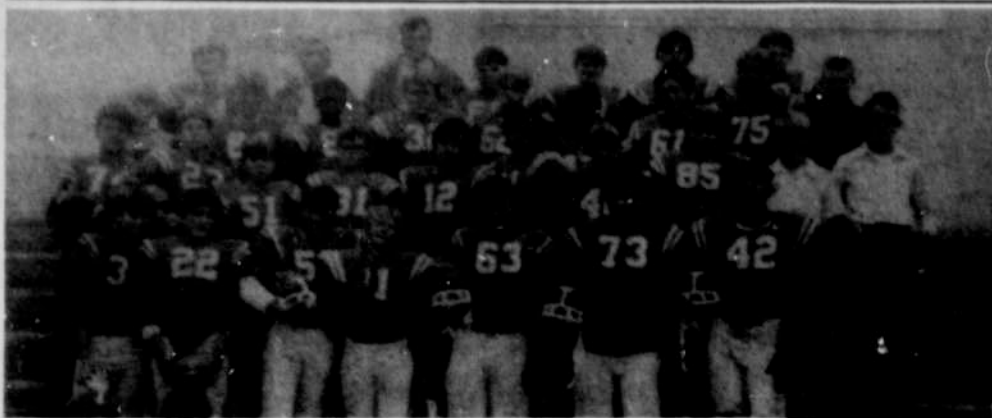

Favorite Foods

The days are getting shorter and the air is more crisp, and we feel more like baking and cooking. When the aroma of freshly baked bread permeates the house it makes it "home." The children will remember this long after they're grown.

This One Bowl Dinner Roll makes roll making easy. Use your electric mixer to do most of the kneading - everything is dumped into one bowl. I use this recipe for all my rolls.

ONE BOWL DINNER ROLLS

2 3/4 to 3 1/4 cups unsifted flour
1/4 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 pkg. Fleischmann's Active Dry Yeast
5 tbsp. softened margarine
2/3 cup very hot tap water
1 egg (at room temperature)
Melted margarine

In large bowl thoroughly mix 3/4 cup flour, sugar, salt and undissolved Active Dry Yeast. Add softened margarine. Gradually add very hot tap water to dry ingredients and beat 2 minutes at medium speed of electric mixer, scraping bowl occasionally. Add egg and 1/2 cup flour, or enough flour to make a thick batter. Beat at

high speed 2 minutes, scraping bowl occasionally. Stir in enough additional flour to make a soft dough. Turn out onto lightly floured board; knead until smooth and elastic, about 8 to 10 minutes. Place in greased bowl, turning to grease top. Cover; let rise in a warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour.

Punch dough down; turn out onto lightly floured board. Shape as desired. Cover; let rise in warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 1 hour.

Carefully brush rolls with melted margarine. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 10 to 15 minutes, or until done. Remove from baking sheets and cool on wire racks.

There's a lot of satisfaction in making a "scratch" cake and when it turns out as well as Chocolate-Jam Cake it's well worth your while.

CHOCOLATE-JAM CAKE

3 cups sifted flour
2 cups sugar
1/2 cup cocoa
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup shortening
2 eggs
1 cup buttermilk
1 teaspoon soda
1 cup Jam (any kind)
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup chopped walnuts
1 cup boiling water
