

Only about 50 percent of the students reported for classes Monday and most of the group returned to work in the fields. Mr. Hartley said that practically all of the 250 students in the high school have jobs.

"It seemed best to harvest the crops because the quicker we get the work done the quicker we can start school," Mr. Hart-

The students are working with various types of crops. Some of the girls are even topping beets, which is considered difficult work. Most of the boys are working the beet fields, according to Frank Parr, high school principal, who has organized the crews.

An additional 75 Japanese from reception centers have arrived in this district within the last two weeks to work in the harvest fields, but the labor situation so far as the beet harvest is concerned is still

Workers are harvesting approximately 10,000 tons of beets a day now, whereas enough labor should be available to
