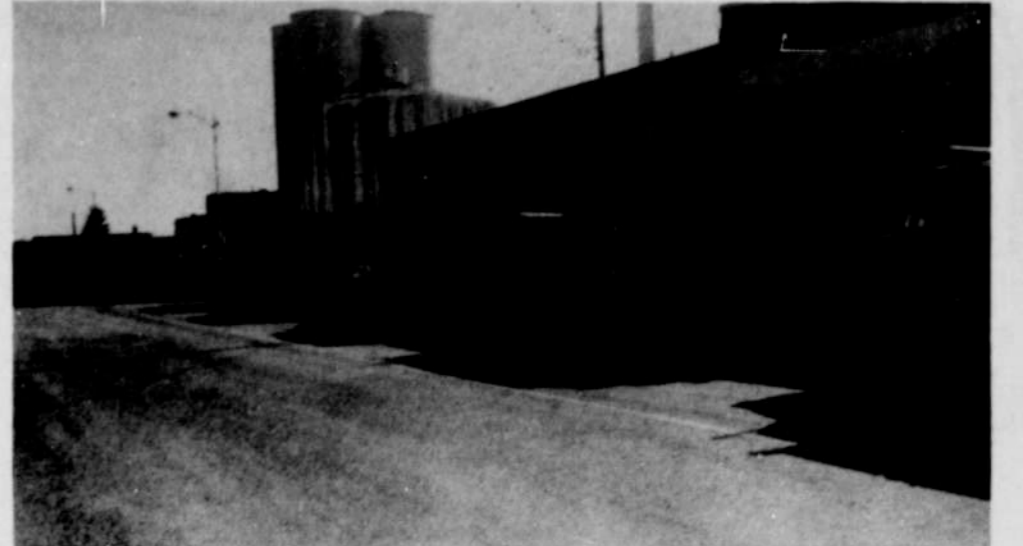

Money Lessons Course Offered State Colleges Set Meeting

"You and Your Money," a four lesson correspondence course prepared at Oregon State University by Alberta Johnston, Extension Home Management Specialist, will be offered in Malheur County starting November 1.

Participants will be limited to the first 200 to register, says Helen Conner, Malheur County Extension Home Economist. In-

terested persons may sign up by sending their name and mailing address to Helen Conner, City Hall, Ontario, Oregon, 97914. Sign-up sheets are also available in many area banks and stores.

Lessons included in the free course are: 1. "Solving the Paycheck Puzzle," which includes budgeting plans.

2. "The Way You Pay Makes a Difference," discusses use and types of credit.

3. "How Much Risk Can You Afford?" Life, health and property insurance.

4. "Your Family's Business Affairs." Information on family business records.

Each lesson includes a short assignment to be returned. Each lesson also includes helpful reference leaflets on money management.

Kidney Association Is Accepting Advance Gifts

The Kidney Association of Oregon has announced that it is now accepting "advance gifts" prior to the opening of its 1972-73 statewide fund drive the week of November 20.

Announced by Al Lemke, Portland, president of the Kidney Association, he said, "All money that is received during the period will be marked 'advance gift' and will be added to the fund drive total."

Lemke explained, "Individuals and organizations who wish to make advance gift contributions are asked to send their tax deductible donations for Malheur County to Post Office Box number 151 in Ontario, and made payable to the Kidney Association of Oregon."

"Hopefully," he said, "there will be a sizeable number of advance gifts prior to the opening of the drive in order to get the campaign off to a flying start."

Lemke added, "The success of KAO's advance gift campaign and its statewide fund drive is vital to the lives of present patients now being treated on home dialysis with artificial kidney machines. It is also extremely important that KAO receive the financial support from the people of Oregon in order to have the funds on hand to admit new patients to its life-saving program by providing them with kidney machines, training and medical supplies so that these people can work, raise their families and be useful people."

KAO must raise \$10,000 for the care of each new patient for the first six months. It also must receive donations of \$4,000 per year for each continuing patient. This amounts to about \$12 per day per patient.

Annual Youth Citizenship Contest Again Sponsored

The Soroptimist Club of Ontario, is sponsoring a Youth Citizenship Contest for any young man or woman who will be graduating from public or private high school or its equivalent, during the 1972-73 school year, but not later than June, 1973.

This is open to students of Malheur County, and application blanks may be obtained from the High Schools or from Mrs. Eleanor L. Anderson, Box D, Ontario, Oregon. The deadline for the entries is January 1, 1973. There will be a first place winner of a \$75.00 United States Savings Bond and second place winner of a \$50.00 Savings Bond.

To qualify for the Awards, which are judged on the merit and worth of the applicant, a student must have fulfilled the following:

SERVICE - Applicant must have taken an active part in service, in the home, in the school and in the community, with a high degree of cooperation, courtesy, and consideration for others.

DEPENDABILITY - Applicant must have executed responsibilities with truthfulness, loyalty and punctuality.

LEADERSHIP - Applicant must have demonstrated ability to lead with self-control, dignity and responsibility.

CLEAR SENSE OF PURPOSE - Applicant must have pursued selected endeavors with sincerity and integrity.

There are no specific dates set within which the applicant has met the above qualifications in school, home and com-

munity.

The candidate must complete the Official Application for Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards.

Substantiating evidence in the form of letters written by three adult individuals not related to the candidate must accompany the application.

In the United States, the National Association of Secondary School Principals has placed the Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards Program on its approved list of National Contests and Activities.

The first place winning essay will be forwarded to the District Competition which winner will then compete in the Regional contest. The winner of the Regional contest will receive an award of \$1,000.00 and the winner of the Federal contest will receive \$1,500.00, making a total of \$2,500.00, which could be won by some lucky Malheur County Senior, together with the local awards.

The Soroptimist Youth Citizenship Awards are not scholarships but are "Awards of Merit." Each award may be used at the discretion of the recipient, in any way he may decide which will best further his aims and purposes in achieving his goal - Education, travel, etc. The cash awards are paid in lump sums to the winning students. If a student is unable to accept a cash award in any state or country, arrangements can be made to make payment in compliance with the law.
