Recreation Research Unit Receives KAB Award

An award in recognition of a program to combat litter in forest recreation areas was presented by Keep America Beautiful, Inc. to the Recreation Research Unit of the Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment Station at an awards banquet at the Plaza Hotel in New York City on November 16.

Under the leadership of Dr. John Hendee, the Recreation Research Unit has sought ways to reduce littering and vandalism in our National Forests through experiments with an incentive program for children. It has been discovered that youngsters can be motivated to pick up litter when offered simple rewards such as shoulder patches, book covers, stickers, and posters featuring the Forest Service symbols of Smokey Bear and Woodys Owl. The initial experiments were begun 3 years ago with theater audiences of youngsters and subsequently moved to selected

campgrounds. Education of both parents and children in the need for behavior showing concern for the environment plus the comparatively low cost of the remaining campground cleanup are features of the program. The experiments will be expanded in the National Forests of Washington and Oregon next year.

The litter control research has been jointly conducted by Dr. Hendee, Dr. Roger Clark, who will travel to New York to accept the award, and Dr. Robert Burgess, sociologist at the University of Washington. The findings of the research team have been reported in several professional journals. Reprints of the articles are available from the Experiment Station at its headquarters, P. O. THIS NEW BUILDING on the TVCC campus has been recently built on the west end of the Administration Building. It is the storage facility for flammable, corrosive and toxic chemicals used in college chemistry classes. The compact fireproof interior, measuring 6'x6'x8' provides shelving in an atmosphere which ranges between 40 and 70 degrees. A steel door controls access, and a refrigerator is provided for the most highly volatile and instable of the organic chemicals.

The combustible and explosive nature of these chemicals made housing them in the chemistry lab highly dangerous. Construction costs were held to a minimum by the college, doing all work but the brick and electrical.
