

American Independent Party To Be Organized

James Shurtliff, acting-Chairman in Malheur County for the American Independent Party, announced today, "plans are now underway for the organizing of the American Independent Party here in Oregon both for the state and county level. We heartily extend a welcome to all patriotic Americans to become acquainted with us and to become familiar with the pledge that we offer to all people of this nation."

The Party's candidate for President of the United States in the recent elections was Congressman John G. Holiday Treats Add Pounds

Do Christmas holidays conjure up visions of sugar plums pumpkin pie, turkey, dressing, nuts, candy, cookies and cake? There's nothing wrong with these visions--or foods--says Susan Coppin, acting extension food and nutrition specialist at Oregon State University. The trouble comes when you eat the special treats along with regular meals. These holiday foods can add more calories than most adults need.

When you eat foods giving you excess calories, the excess is stored as fat. Sometimes this fat accumulates where you want

it least and where it shows most. So if you are looking ahead to being slim in January, avoid eating excess calories now, advises Miss Coppin.

If the worst happens, however, and you do gain some unwanted pounds, reduce your calories and increase your exercise until you return to your normal weight, suggests the OSU nutritionist.
