Social Security Changes Laws Regarding Children

Several major changes have been made in the Social Security law regarding children. Two important changes are explained briefly below. 1. A child dependent upon a grandparent can now be eligible for benefits on that grandparent's social security if the child's natural or adoptive parents are deceased or disabled. The child must have been living with and receiving at least 1/2 support from the grandparent in the year before the grandparent became entitled to benefit payments.

In case of death of a grandparent the same dependency requirements must be met except that the limitation on parents is changed and the surviving grandparent must adopt the child.

2. A child that is adopted by a worker eligible for retirement or disability benefits and who was living with and dependent upon the worker for 12 months before entitlement to social security can be eligible for child's benefits. Any qualified child who's adoption occurred after 1967 may qualify retroactive to date of adoption. The law provides that the applications must be filed by the end of April 1973. Anyone falling in this category should contact a social security office before the end of April 1973. After April 1973 benefits cannot be paid for months before October 1972.

Because the laws are complicated and quite restrictive it is important that all possible cases be brought to the attention of the Social Security Administration immediately. Should you know a child who might qualify for this type of benefit have them get in touch with the social security office

Bank Debits Up In October

Bank debits for the 8 reporting banks including Harney and Malheur counties were up in October, 1972, compared to October, 1971, the University of Oregon Bureau of Business and Economic Research has reported. Debits for October, 1972, totaled \$65,543,000. For September, 1972, the total was \$56,687,000 and for October, 1971, the total was \$54,893,000.

Oregon with 405 banks reporting had a percentage increase of 4.7 in October, 1972, as compared with September, 1972, and a 22% increase in October, 1972 compared with October, 1971.

Total bank debits for October 1972 came to \$6,727,091,000. For September, 1972, the total was \$6,424,538,000 and for October, 1971, the total was \$5,514,293,000.

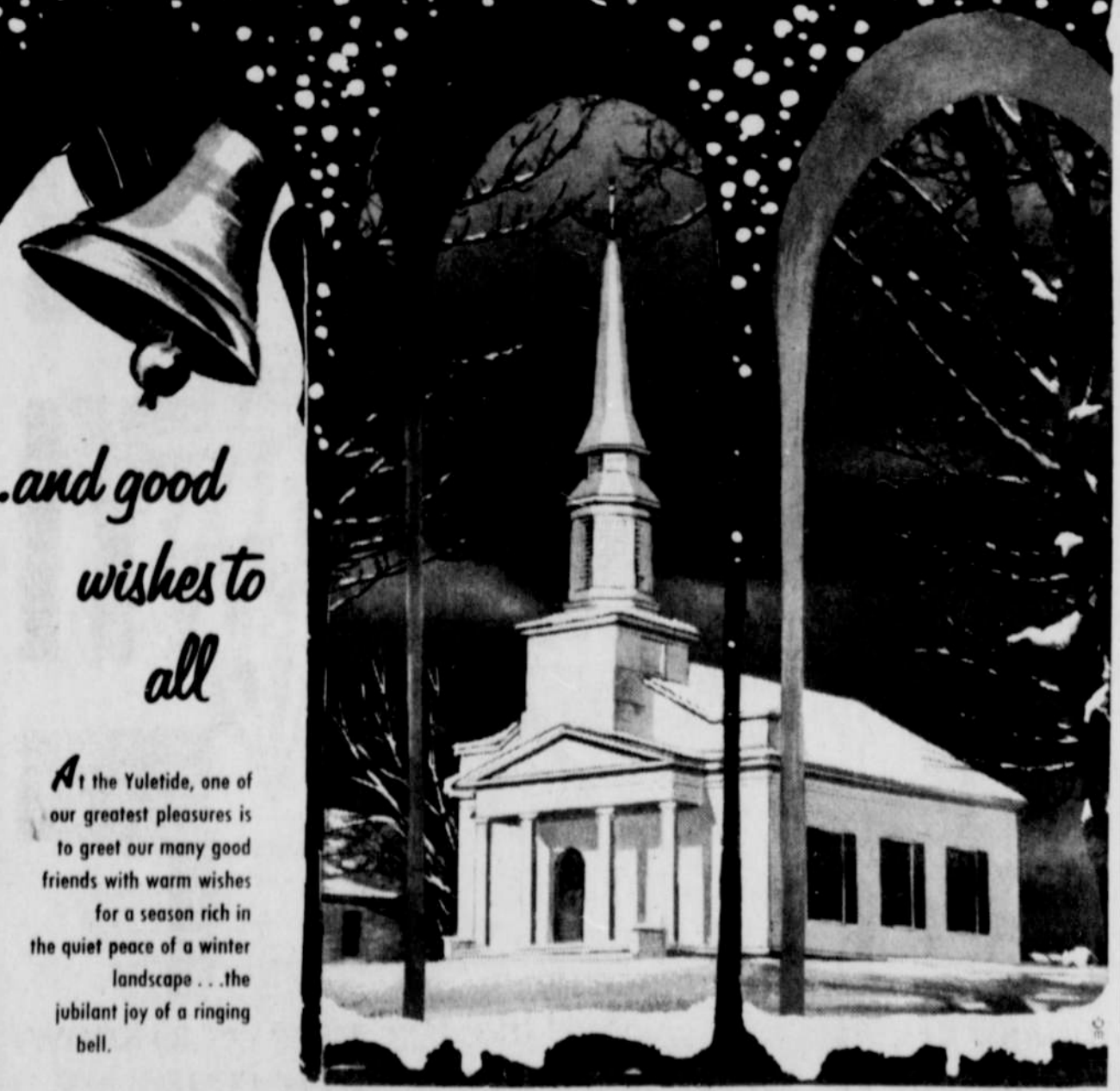
